##### Candidates:

  - At the moment bar is quite under-used esp. on weeknights e.g. wine and cheese night last week was a real success; focus on 5<sup>th</sup> week blues events, blue music, fun events all through the week e.g. every day of the week to boost morale
  - More open mic nights – use lots of Keble talent: live music, DJing, spoken word, stand-up comedy on a fortnightly basis --- charges per entry to increase the budget which can be used to make bops more frequent --- ultimate aim (Wadham has a Bop every 2 weeks)
  - Bops – make a bigger thing, doing different genres of music, depending on which club nights are on that evening; give more notice, advertise them earlier in advance; free drink window for the first part of the bop – put money behind the bar
  - Movie nights – use college spaces, nice to watch a film with everyone
  - Use the bar more often, good space, good to socialise in e.g. informal beer evening every week – get people out of their rooms a bit more
  - Entertainment doesn't have to revolve around alcohol e.g. food related events, pizza in the JCR (free food!), movie nights

  - Building on work of previous officers: bop tails, photos at bops, use of different spaces in college for events e.g. o'reilley for film nights; few new ideas:
  - For bops – make themes funs and easy to dress up for e.g. Noah's ark, use themed music e.g. Northern Soul bop, musical eras, holidays incl. Valentine's masquerade ball, dress as yourself as 30 years in the future, end of MT bop for freshers to come with college spouse; make sure there are incentives for people to arrive early e.g. drinks tokens only valid for the first hour, give more notice for bop themes;
  - Other than bops – film nights, rounders in TT in Uni Parks with Pimms, summer 8s events subsidise pimms for Keble students
  - Involve members of college to perform in the bar, work with Arts & Pubs and Welfare teams

  - Make sure that groups of people wanting to come to Keble Bops to have prior notice; students responsible for guest's behaviour

### **Motion 1: NOTES magazine funding**

This JCR (punningly) notes that

1. NOTES Magazine is a literary and arts magazine that prints every two weeks. NOTES receives submissions from across the university and beyond, and by virtue of its open submissions acceptance policy and affiliation with NOTES Cambridge (another branch of the same publication) it prints from a wider pool of submissions and perspectives than most equivalent literary/arts magazines within Oxford.
2. NOTES magazine has already formed a close link to the creative body at Keble College, being not only edited by one of Keble's members, but also consistently receiving contributions from Keble's undergraduate body.

3. As a fortnightly publication, NOTES is able to receive submissions on a rolling basis and to represent a wider range of voices than those magazines that pare down submissions from an equivalently large pool to a single, termly issue.

This JCR believes that

1. NOTES Magazine represents the voices of Oxford's, and Keble's, creative community with a degree of openness and frequency that deserves to be supported

This JCR therefore resolves to

1. Make a subscription to NOTES Magazine, purchasing 15 copies of each issue (for a total of 60 copies a term) to be placed in the JCR and made available to Keble's students.
2. Each issue costs £1, and the JCR therefore resolves to set aside £60, termly, for the purpose of supporting NOTES Magazine and making it more widely available.
3. The 'termly' clause of this resolution, as well as the quantity of issues is open to amendment.

#### **Issues Raised:**

- **Proposer:** Keble is quite related to NOTES magazine, editors and submissions; prints frequently and not expensively we can support this, doesn't have much support as of yet
- **How does this work out practically?** The money will come out of the general spend every year
- **Are they going to be kept in the JCR?** Happy to put stamps in all or some of them so they don't get removed, in the JCR, JCR2 and café
- **Is this on a rolling basis, will we be doing this every year?** *Friendly amendment* – fund NOTES just for this year
