

MOTION ONE: Sexual Consent at University,

This JCR notes that:

- According to the results of a survey conducted by NUS, 1 in 7 women students (14%) has been the victim of serious sexual assault or serious physical violence while at university or college,
- 2. The same study found that only 4% of women students sexually assaulted reported the assault to their institution.
- 3. The OUSU-led program Consent in Common Rooms has been impact-assessed and judged a success by other Oxford colleges in raising awareness and promoting discussion of the issues of sex crime and sexual consent.
- 4. A pilot Sexual Consent Workshop was held at Keble in 3rd Week. The post-workshop assessment forms all rated the workshop highly and many included the suggestion that such an event should be held every year by the Equal Opportunities Officer.

This JCR belies that:

- 1. The JCR should work to create a safe and supportive environment for all its members.
- 2. Mandating the Equal Opps Officer to hold a Sexual Consent Workshop every Michaelmas will help to increase awareness of the issue of consent and sex crime at university. This will help to create a safer and more supportive environment for its members.

This JCR therefore resolves to:

1. Mandate the Equal Opportunities Officer to undertake facilitator training for the Sexual Consent Workshop at OUSU and to hold the event within the first 4 weeks of Michaelmas every year.
