Motion One: Funding for Edinburgh Fringe Production

This JCR notes that:

- As shown by the success of Keble Arts Week, and other student productions, the Arts and in particular Theatre Shows are a very important part of Society
- The cost of putting on a theatre show is often very high, and impossible to cover from students' personal funds
- Grants from Production Companies and other sources are very competitive
- This JCR has a lot of capital that could be used by the student population for the arts
- A Keble student and JCR Member is taking part in a show which will be shown in Oxford, London, and at the Edinburgh Fringe

This JCR believes that:

 No students should be prevented from taking part in Theatre and the Arts purely for financial reasons

This JCR therefore resolves to:

 Offer Ba-Laylah productions a pro-rata loan of £800 to cover advance costs for their production of `Midnight at the Rue Morgue` at the Edinburgh Fringe, such as lighting equipment hire, costumes, marketing material, props and scenery.

- TEDxOxford is a nonprofit organising Oxford's annual independent TEDx conference.
- TEDxOxford brings together the world's best speakers with Oxford's young and bright.
- TEDxOxford 2012 was a huge success: it sold out and raised about £1,700 for charity.
- TEDxOxford 2013 will, once more, bring the world's most amazing speakers to Oxford.

 TEDxOxford needs access to early funding so that it can start planning the next conference.

This JCR believes:

- Promoting the intellectual exchange of ideas and access to education is a good cause.
- People should not have to pay a ridiculous \$6,000 to attend a TED conference (TEDxOxford tickets sold at £10 last year).

This JCR resolves to:

- Donate £200 to the cause of TEDxOxford.
- Support TEDxOxford by mentioning it in a college newsletter closer to the conference.

- It is important to recognise the sporting achievements of its members and to support fundraising efforts for a worthwhile cause.

Motion Four: JCR Leavers Talbot Fund Contribution

This JCR notes that:

- 1. The College is a charity and is therefore reliant on donors for much of its income.
- 2. It is the College's aim to provide the best facilities of the highest standard to all current

and future students.

- 3. All members of this JCR are matriculated members of Keble College for life.
- 4. The Talbot Fund is an annual fund generated from donations which is used by College to provide most of the facilities and financing that are currently available to the students.
- 5. Since the Talbot Fund was established in 2002 it has provided:
- 76 Room Refurbishments
- 1 Pipe Organ for the Chapel
- 1 Hall restoration nearly complete.
- 730 Bursaries
- 91 Scholarships
- 96 Plays
- 308 Music Recitals & Masterclasses
- 14 Cuppers wins
- 8 Rowing blades
- 6. Each year the size of the student body at Keble grows, placing extra demand on the College's resources.
- 7. When we first came to College each student deposited a £150 in 'Caution Money' which is returned to us at the end of our last Trinity Term.

This JCR believes that:

- 1. Without the Talbot Fund our times at Keble would have been much the poorer, both in experience and financially.
- 2. The continued reputation of Keble College as a centre of excellence in academia and extra-curricular activities is important to our futures.
- 3. We owe it to future Keblites to ensure that they get as good an experience as we got.

This JCR therefore resolves to:

- 1. Each gift £20 to the Talbot Fund through each member's last battels instalment (in our third or fourth Trinity Term, depending on course length) by deducting it from the £150 'Caution Money' deposited with College.
- 2. To adopt the proposals as set out in the appended document ('Talbot Society Proposal/Info for JCR Members) and agree to its terms including the individual opt-out clause and membership to the Talbot Society.

Motion Seven: PS3 in the Bar

This JCR notes that:

This JCR believes that:

- 1. The bar would benefit financially from the addition of a PS3 due to the increase in visitors.
- 2. Members of the JCR deserve to maintain their gaming skills during term time and currently do not have the opportunity to do so.
- 3. The addition of a PS3 gives rise to possible gaming events such as a Keble world cup FIFA competition. Certificate for winner.

This JCR therefore resolves to:

- 1. Purchase a PS3 console (slim mod, 12 GB, one controller included) for the bar for £150.
- 2. Purchase 3 extra consoles at £20 each.
- 3. Purchase 3 games (for now), a survey of which ones to buy to be emailed round. To be

used free of charge by visitors to the bar.

4. ALL on the basis that a new TV is purchased which has an HDMI cable. Talks are going ahead between the bar sub-committee and the domestic bursar on Wednesday as to who will pay for this.

Motion Eight: Prostate Cancer UK Donation

This JCR notes that:

- 1. Prostate Cancer UK is a national charity that does outstanding work in researching treatments for prostate cancer, and providing support for the families of patients.
- 2. 37,000 men are diagnosed each year in the UK, and there is no way of knowing who prostate cancer might affect until it does.
- 3. We raise a large sum of money for the charity every November, but that charities need help with funding throughout the year.
- 4. Prostate Cancer UK is one of the charities nominated by Oxford RAG to receive donations from their charity skydive.

This JCR believes that:

- 1. We should maintain our support for Prostate Cancer UK all year, so that they can continue to carry out their work.
- 2. As the RAG charity skydive is on Wednesday of 2nd Week, this would be an excellent time to show support; a member of this JCR is taking part in the jump for Prostate Cancer UK.

1. Make a donation of £150 to the charity Prostate Cancer UK, by way of making a donation for that amount to the fundraising campaign of Andrew Hall's RAG skydive.
